1. THE MASS – MAKING SUNDAY MASS A PRIORITY

The Ideal State

- Parishioners encounter Christ in the Sacred Liturgy - the source and summit of our faith
- Parishioners are drawn in to joyfully participate in the sacred liturgy
- The beauty of the services and environment evangelizes participants

Five-year Goals

- Foster an understanding of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist
- Facilitate an understanding of the Mass experience
- Engage, educate, and inspire with scripture and homiletics
- Provide a pathway for those searching for answers and seeking God
- Create a welcoming atmosphere for all who attend Mass
- Create an atmosphere of beauty in church services and the sanctuary

2. FORMATION – Pursuing a life-long journey of faith formation

The Ideal State

- Opportunities exist for all parishioners to deepen their understanding of the Catholic faith and grow in their relationship with Christ
- Every parishioner is encouraged to pursue a life long journey of faith formation
- All parishioners are equipped and motivated to evangelize others

Five-year Goals

- Develop faith formation programs for all ages
- Inform and connect parishioners with diocesan and national resources for individual and communal faith formation
- Use small groups to accompany individuals on their faith journey
- Evaluate the implementation of "The Rescue Project" (Father John Ricardo)
- Evaluate the implementation of an "Alpha" program

3. YOUNG FAMILIES – Supporting families in understanding the importance of their Catholic faith

- Young families are supported and inspired to know and love their Catholic faith
- Faith formation is embraced as an integral part of family life
- Spirituality, social engagements, and service are combined into engaging activities

- Childcare needs are addressed
- Families with special needs children are supported
- St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic School and Catholic Faith Formation families are fully welcomed into the parish community
- Small groups formed to support extended families in their faith journey

4. YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS – Ensuring their integral part in parish life The Ideal State Five-year Goals

- Youth and young adults are integrated into parish life for both religious and social engagement and growth

- Invite young adults to participate in the life of the parish
- Provide a safe environment for youth to socialize with other faith focused peers
- Encourage youth to serve as liturgical ministers
- Foster opportunities (invitations) for youth to participate in parish ministries
- Mentor individuals to assume leadership roles
- Promote diocesan and deanery activities to foster a sense of community with other youth in the diocese

5. LEADERSHIP – Building and developing Christian leaders

THIS IS THE HOUR OF LIGHT!

LET US BRING IT INTO THE SHADOWS!

Is Christ's light apparent in me? Do others see it?

We should be asking ourselves as missionary disciples, what's that one thing more that I can be doing? How can I prepare, grow and be a steward of faith, hope and love?

1 Hour of Prayer – Give God one hour of prayer. Spend time listening to Him, reading scripture, and adoring Him.

Who does God want me to reach out to in love and service? Who is God placing in my heart that needs a word of encouragement or an invitation to encounter Jesus?

- **1 Hour of Talent** Give back to God the talents and gifts he gave you. What are your strengths and capabilities? Offer these to God and neighbor, building up the Kingdom of God, volunteering from your heart and knowing it is God's work within you.
- 1 Hour of your Treasure Give to God and contribute funds to support the ministerial work of the parish. The disciples of Jesus' day likewise depended on the generosity of the faithful to carry out their mission. What is one hour of treasure? One hour of wages per week? Hypothetically, stretching to our limits for God as Living Lights, if every disciple managed \$30 per week, Good Shepherd Parish would steward more that \$500,000 a month!
