Comfort Blankets & Teddy Bears to benefit W.E.A.V.E

Summary: Students will purchase fleece material to make "no-sew" blankets & donate new or gently used teddy bears to benefit W.E.A.V.E. – a non-profit organization that shelters and provides services to victims of domestic abuse in the Sacramento area. W.E.A.V.E. brings comfort to EVERY person (child & adult) with a blanket & Teddy Bear that comes through their shelter. W.E.A.V.E. encourages gender neutral fleece material for the blankets, but it's okay if you choose gender specific fleece material.

- ➤ IF making 2 Small Blankets (for a young child, toddler, or infant): 4 cuts of fleece materials (your choice of coordinating patterns/colors), each cut of material should be 1.25 yards in length.

PLUS...

- 2 yards of 2-inch wide cloth ribbon: this will be used to tie the teddy bear and blanket together to make a complete package. (if making more than 1 blanket, have a 2 yard cut of ribbon for each blanket).
 - ❖ JoAnn's Fabrics also has kits with pre-cut fleece material. If you'd like, you can purchase one (or more) of those. Please check the sizes if purchasing a kit and make sure that they are close to the dimensions above...I.e. one large kit or 2 small kits.
- 1 Teddy Bear for each blanket you are making. Teddy Bears can be NEW or GENTLY USED. If donating a gently used Teddy Bear, PLEASE wash and dry it (it does great in the washer & dryer) at home before bringing it with you.
- 1 GOOD pair of <u>FABRIC SCISSORS</u> per student & parent so everyone can help with cutting and tying the material.
